Introduction

During the reporting period the National Officers have met a few times, as also the managing committees of some projects and regions. A National Staff Consultation was held in June 2019, as also a YMCA Professional Secretaries Consultation in July 2019. Communication channels with all YMCAs have been revived through the quarterly magazine 'Youth of India'. Four issues have been published.

Most YMCAs celebrated and conducted special programmes in connection with the 175th Anniversary Celebrations of World YMCAs. Environmental protection and awareness programmes, empowerment of youth, charitable activities and relief activities in the flood and other disaster affected areas was actively done by almost all unit YMCAs in India under the leadership of National President, Justice J.B. Koshy (Retd.). 90% of the Professional Secretaries are also actively participating in the activities of NCYI.

The Delhi High Court has directed that election of 11 members to the National Executive should be conducted by March 31, 2020 under Court supervision. Consequently, the Election Committee headed by Justice Kurian Joseph (Retd.), former Judge Supreme Court of India, conducted election for 11 members to the National Executive on February 20, 2020 at Ernakulam.

National Board Meeting February 22, 2020, Ernakulam

The Meeting was held on February 22, 2020, at Cardinal Parecattil Memorial Renewal Centre, Azad Road, Kaloor, Ernakulam, Kerala, attended by 282 delegates. Various National **Standing Committees** and Project Management Committees were formed.









FANI Rehabilitation Programme

The first phase of rehabilitation programme was launched in three locations, namely Bhubaneswar, Cuttack and Tankibellary from July 1, 2019.

Powerful Cyclone Fani, at its worst an "extremely severe" storm, brought heavy rainfall and winds of 209 km/h to communities across India's east coast on May 3, 2019. The approach of the cyclone – one of the strongest storms to hit the Indian subcontinent in decades – was met with intense disaster preparedness work by the State Government in evacuating millions of people in the cyclone's path. In Odisha, about 1.1 million people were evacuated away from the coast.

Total human causalities- 64 dead and 1,40,60,602 affected.

It also stated that 14 districts of the state, namely Angul, Balasore, Bhadrak, Cuttack, Dhenkanal, Ganjam, Jagatsinghpur, Jajpur, Kendrapara, Keonjhar, Khordha, Mayurbhanj, Nayagarh and Puri were affected by the severe cyclonic storm. A Mission trip to Bhubaneswar, Cuttack and Bhagatpur was undertaken by Mr. Udipta Fullonton to understand the devastation caused by FANI. A joint meeting of YMCAs was conducted at Bhubaneswar YMCA under the Chairmanship Mr D K Pradhan- President of Bhubaneswar YMCA.

The final proposal was obtained and the first phase of rehabilitation programme was launched in three locations, namely Bhubaneswar, Cuttack and Tankibellary from July 1, 2019. This phase will be complete by mid-August. The proposal for second phase rehabilitation is prepared and has been submitted to partners.



COVID-19 Relief Work

The Novel Corona Virus leading to COVID-19 was sudden and scary. Despite the constraint of financial resources, the Indian YMCA Movement responded in a befitting manner, which was both varied and community-driven. With rich heritage of service, especially in times of natural and man-made crises over several decades, the Indian YMCA Movement since March 2020 displayed its response-ability with distinction.

More than six lakhs of cooked food were supplied, along with food grains, sanitation kits. Much needed counseling services were provided.



Christian Mission & Development Concerns

YWCA/YMCA Week of Prayer and World Fellowship

YWCA/YMCA Week of Prayer and World Fellowship observance This year's YWCA/YMCA Week of Prayer and World Fellowship was held during November 10-16, 2019, on the theme 'Young people transforming power structures for gender equality'. The inaugural service was held at Free Church, Parliament Street, Delhi on Sunday, November 10. The YMCA/YWCA community across the city observed the Week of Prayer while, the NCYI organized theirs at the Dr. S. Sathianadhan Conference Hall on November 16, on the sub-theme, "Leaving no one behind", when Rev. Timothy Shaw, graced the occasion as speaker.





L&DO tax matters: It is to be noted that NCYI has applied the provision for a reduced tax option granted by the Land and Development Organization for socio-cultural organization such as ours vide the L&DO office order of 2012. When this comes to effect it will translate into saving of about Rs. 75 lakhs annually for NCYI. Currently discussions are on, to avail the benefit. Consequently the 30% of the rent to L & D O as tax from 2012 to 2017 instead of 10% need to be adjusted in subsequent payments. Efforts are on to adjust the excess amount subsequently from future tax amount payable.

Among the several contentious property issues, which continue to confront the NCYI, the major highlights include:

Jabalpur – The National Board resolved on December 28, 2014, in Mangalore to dispose off the Jabalpur property inclusive of the ground floor and six other floors for a consideration of Rs. 5.25 crores. The builder, in a letter dated September 23, 2018, informed the NCYI that they are willing to pay the remaining amount of Rs. 3.25 crores and asked 3 or 4 sets of dates for execution of the Sale Deed.

Wellington – The Secretary of State for India in council granted a perpetual lease of an extent of 1 Acre 50 Cents at Wellington Cantonment in favour of Bishop of Madras on August 9, 1910. Certain buildings were put up by the YMCA, and some activities were conducted. Subsequently, a fresh lease deed dated October 23, 1931, was executed by the Government of India, where the maximum lease period contemplated is 90 years renewable once every 30 years. The NCYI is a beneficial Lessee of the property and can claim compensation for vacating the premises. The buildings are in a dilapidated condition, and repair etc. will require permission from the Cantonment Board.

Calcutta – An agreement to sell property on Russell Street was executed between the NCYI and M/s. Om Credit Pvt. Ltd. on January 12, 1990. Litigations are still pending with the tenants. The agreement to sell needs to be registered.

Delhi – An agreement was executed on July 4, 1995, between the NCYI and M/s. Om Credit Pvt. Ltd. A supplementary agreement was executed on December 19, 1995, and a third agreement was executed on June 29, 2005, incorporating the first two agreements with further modifications. Sharing of area was marked in an annexed map which appears to be missing.

Lucknow – On August 13, 1962, the NCYI purchased Lucknow property measuring 65,716 sq. ft. On December 31, 1983, approximately 2800 sq. mts. (A & B wing) was leased out to Shri Kishori Lal and Sanjay Agarwal (Partners of M/s) Motilal & Co. for a period of 65 years. On December 5, 2006, another agreement was executed between the NCYI and M/s. S. Gupta of Buildteck Pvt. Ltd. On April 8, 2015, a tripartite agreement was signed, removing Lucknow YMCA and introducing M/s. Taraninfra Pvt. Ltd. as one of the parties along with the NCYI and M/s Gupta Buildtech Pvt. Ltd.

Women's Empowerment & Gender Concerns



Regional Women Assembly at Gopalpur

The 10th Regional Women Assembly was organized on December 5-6, 2019, at Carry Retreat Center in Gopalpur, hosted by YMCA Berhampur. 40 delegates participated from the YMCAs of – Berhampur, Bhubaneswar, Calcutta, Mandapara, Sambalpur and G. Udayagiri. The keynote address on the theme - "Young Women Transforming Power Structure for Gender Equality" was delivered by Miss Jyotsna Rani Patra. While dealing with topics like gender justice, gender conflict and resistance to change, men and women should come together and sort out effective ways for the greater benefit of society.

The second session on 'Creating a safe world for women' was chaired by Mrs. Jayashree Pradhan. She had emphasized that, women, child and even old ladies are not safe. Men should treat females as their mothers and sisters. The third session on 'Role of women as Missionary Leaders in the YMCA' was chaired by Dr. Ms. Ratna Sahu, Prof. of Berhampur University. The Mission of YMCA is to establish God's Kingdom on earth through peace and other programs for social upliftment especially for the poor and destitute people. braille printing. Plant trees in apartments, hills, mangrove areas to increase green area. Introduce eco-bags instead of plastic bags, and make promotional videos for this purpose. Reduce waste drastically. Educate YMCA staff on environmental awareness. Organize Zero Burning Campaign, and do not burn tree leaves but make them compost manures. Use more LED lights instead of conventional lights and form Green Teams in the YMCAs.



APAY 20th General Assembly & 4th Youth Assembly

September 1-6, 2019, Tozanso, Japan



The 20th General Assembly and the 4th Youth Assembly of the Asia and Pacific Alliance of YMCAs (APAY) were held from September 1-6, 2019 in Tokyo and Tozanso, Japan. The 377 delegates including 130 youth delegates from 22 countries, met to evaluate APAY's programs for the past four years and to discuss the future directions of the movement in the next quadrennium and beyond.

Based on the theme, "Living Together Within Nature on a Path to Peace," the Assembly focused primarily on the issue of environment protection and peace restoration. The keynote presentation emphasized on the need to work for a peace culture by holding on to the goal of universal health and

well-being, and the nonviolent resolution of conflicts to the satisfaction of all parties. The YMCAs were challenged to consider two immediate tasks: one, to abandon industrial agriculture, radically reduce reliance on petroleum, and build selfsupporting and sustainable communities by working with and not against nature; and two, to engage in a campaign to abolish nuclear weapons. YMCAs were also urged to focus less on money, and more on a common mission, larger than the YMCA itself. To do this, we must look to Jesus, the Prince of Peace.
